He was a member of the management committee at Nortonbury and then at Wymondley Wood where he maintained the electrical system and took on responsibility for Health and Safety and Risk Assessments and, for a period he also compiled the District Directory.

It was a pleasure to be in his company. He was a friendly person who always had a pleasant smile and never said 'no' whatever the request.

He loved Scouting and the joy and training for life which it gives young people. He was never happier than when he was watching young people enjoying Scouting activities.

Peter Norton and Frederick (Fred) Eaves June 2018

It is with sadness that we have to report the deaths of two former District Commissioners of Letchworth and Baldock District.

Fred Eaves who had previously been Chairman of the local branch of the B-P Scout Guild was appointed DC. in 1967 and served until 1976 and was awarded the Medal of Merit for his services to Scouting. He died on 15th June 2018 at the great age of 98 years.

Fred was succeeded by **Peter Norton** who had been an enthusiastic member of the B-P Scout Guild and later District Secretary before taking up the role of DC. He served in this position until 1984 during which time he was responsible for the opening of the Norton Bury Scout And Guide Centre. Later he was an active member of the Norton Bury Management Committee and from 1991 to 1993 was District Chairman. Peter died on 13th June 2018 in Bishop's Castle in Shropshire at the age of 86.
