Here are the Scout Association top tips for staying safe around bonfire night.

It will soon be bonfire night, the loudest, sparkliest night of the year! If you're taking your young people to an organised display, or having a bonfire and some sparklers at your meeting place this year, take a look at the following tips to keep everyone nice and safe.

Fireworks:

- Only adults should ever deal with fireworks
- Ensure fireworks are not pointing towards anyone
- Never pick up a firework or relight one that has not gone off
- Ensure everyone stands at a safe distance

Sparklers:

- Wear gloves and hold sparklers at arm's length
- Don't wave sparklers at anyone or run while holding them
- Be careful if you're wearing a long scarf or big coat the sparks could set it alight
- Put sparklers in a bucket of water when you're finished as they can stay very hot

Bonfires:

- If someone gets burnt, cool the area with running water for at least 10mins, then cover with clean, non-fluffy material like cling film
- If clothing catches fire, remember: stop, drop, roll
- Never use an accelerant, like paraffin or petrol, on a fire
- Make sure that the fire is completely out before you leave the site

Book a family trip on a river cruiser up the Ouse from Bedford Marina, of course.



The Scout Association have announced that European Space Agency Astronaut, Major Tim Peake as of 1 October has become a Ambassador for Scouting. Best known for spending 186 days in the International Space Station and running a marathon in space, he is also a former Cub Scout and an advocate of the power of Scouting to help young people develop skills for life.

This announcement comes ahead of World Space Week (4 - 10 October), and the Scout Association will also be launching new resources for Leaders to use with their section from the UK Space Agency.

It was a trip with the Cub Scouts that got the young Tim first interested in space and he went on to have an extensive career as a test pilot.

He Said "I remember being a Cub Scout and going on those early night hikes and the first sleepovers outdoors. How exciting is that for young boys and girls.?.

"Staring at the stars, the big questions came up, 'Wow, look at that universe, look at the milky way, what's out there?"

The father-of-two credits Scouting with equipping him for his high-flying career.

"It's down to your character and personality" he said.

We ate burgers and hot dogs for tea ,sang songs from different countries around the camp fire and played wide games in the dark.


The Beavers also showed good signs of the early floordrobe.


