No: 662 County Expedition to Swaziland

Once again a large contingent from Letchworth and Baldock District took part in the County expedition to Swaziland. We flew from Heathrow to Johannesburg and then drove in minibuses to Swaziland stopping for one night in Nelsprit on the way.

Arriving in Malibeni was so exciting. We had left the project site in 2016 with the youth centre walls built up to knee height. Bob the Builder and his team had worked wonders over the last few months and the building was up! Roof was on, windows in, doors in place. There was a 'long drop' toilet dug in the corner of the plot and our container that had been loaded at Phasels was on site and still secure.

Over the next few days we put glass in the windows, built a make shift kitchen from breeze blocks and pallets, built a very smart looking barbecue and emptied the container. Then we could service the many bikes, build the library, sort and distribute the clothes.

We had a big launch day when the building was officially handed over to the local community. This was attended by the Village Elders, school teachers and head teacher, the local Youth Council and all the village folk. There was singing, dancing, music and a large meal for everyone. The building has lots of equipment for everyone to use. Books, stationary, craft, musical instruments and will be a focal point for many in the community but especially the young people.

While we there we ran a soup kitchen for the local children. Each day we had more and more children come along. Many of them with big smiles and happy to play and chat to us. Some that came along had very little and did not have the confidence to engage with us so well. We fed them all and helped those in greater need as much as we could. We even took one lad to the local clinic to have his eye infection treated



Our last few days in Africa we spent at a game reserve and then a hotel. We went white water rafting and saw lots of animals in the safari park where we stayed. We went sight seeing in South Africa and ate at a traditional street brae.

This was a great trip for those that had been before and those that had not. So many new friends were made. Photos were taken and the life experience was shared. We were lucky to take part and made memories that will last a life time.

We learnt lots and understand far more than we did before. 'Skills for Life'

Beaver Scouts and Cubs Scouts






Early September, Oak Eagles ESU had a great weekend backwoods camping at Harmer Green. The weather was warm and sunny and the midges were plentiful.
