District Events

Over the sixty years Co-Ordinator has reported on a number of events, some of which are still going strong today.

Dictionary of District Competitions as recorded in July 1977

BARTON SHIELD - Presented by Mr John Barton for Scout First Aid. Annual from 1955: a Patrol contest from 1968: biennial from 1970.

BLAXLAND TROPHY - Presented by Mr Sydney Blaxland for Cub Scouts arts and crafts. Annual from 1968.

B-P GUILD CUP - Presented by the B-P Scout Guild for the Scout winter patrol competition. Annual from 1958, biennial from 1970.

CUB SCOUT FIRST AID TROPHY - Presented by Mrs Hannah Moules for competition by Pack teams. Annual form 1961

CUB SCOUT FOOTBALL LEAGUE - See MORGANS TROPHY

CUB SCOUT QUIZ - Inter-pack quiz took place at least as early as 1956. Trophy presented by Mr Balaam from competition by Pack teams. Annual from 1959 - 1974. **CUB SCOUT SPORTS** - Green and Gold Cords for inter pack contests took place as early as 1944, replace in 1948 by a Sports Shield for contest annually till 1967 **CUB SCOUT SWIMMING** - Inter-pack sports took place at least as early as 1956: trophy presented by B-P Scout Guild in 1959. Annual.

CYCLCROSS TROPHY - Presented by Mr Ken Hart for Scout troop teams. Annual from 1969

CYCLOCROSS TROPHY FOR CUB SCOUTS - Annual from 1974 **EAVES TROPHY** - Presented by Mr Fred Eaves for Venture Scout Unit arts and crafts. Annual, concurrent with PLINSTON TROPHY. From 1968, but in 1969 opened to individual adults over 16.

HALL TROPHY - Presented by Mr Ernie Hall for Scouts troop teams in general knowledge quiz. Annual from 1969.

HOWES TROPHY - Presented in 1971 by Mr Tommy Howes for the Group winning the "Just For Fun League" (began in 1963), annual aggregate of points won in all other District contests in a calendar year.

ICKNIELD SHIELD - Presented in1930 for annual camping competition. Patrol contest from 1968.

JIM NORTHOVER MEMORIAL SHIELD - Presented by Mrs Northover in 1971. Annual for Scout Patrol winning District "great patrol hunt" running through Calendar year. **JIM'S MYSTERY TOUR** - For Senior Scout troop teams, biennial from 1962 - 1968; biennial from 1974 for teams of Venture Scouts and Scouts over 15, .

KNOCKOUT TROPHY - Presented by Mr G Dales for annual contest by Cub Scout packs, replacing the PIXMORE-HARMERGREEN TROPHY. Annual from 1974 to 1975.

MORGANS TROPHY - Presented by Mr Don Morgans for Cub Scout teams in football league. Annual from1971.

NIGHTJAR TROPHY - Presented by Mr John Davies to replace **POTHUNTERS' TROPHY** for Senior Scouts night exercise. Annual from 1962

- 1969: then for older Scouts, biennial from 1973 to 1975, annual from 1976.
 PIXMORE SHIELD renamed HARMERGREEN TROPHY - Presented in 1958 for annual Cub football contest, replaced in 1971 by MORGANS TROPHY. The renamed Harmergreen Trophy became biennial for outdoor activities by Packs teams, from 1970 to 1972, but was replaced by the KNOCKOUT TROPHY in 1974.

PLINSTON TROPHY - Presented by Mr Horace Plinston, for Group with highest aggregate in arts and crafts contest. Annual from 1965.

POTHUNTERS' TROPHY - Annual contest for Senior Scout troop from 1947 - 1961. Replaced in 1962 by NIGHTJAR TROPHY.

SCOUT FOOTBALL CUP - Presented by Mr Ken Hart for annual contest by Scout troop teams, from 1970. Annual six-a-side contest from 1972. **SCOUT REGATTA** - Annual form 1975.

SCOUTS SPORTS SHIELD - Annual for troop teams, from 1951.

SCOUT SWIMMING SHIELD - Annual for troop teams, from 1959. **SENIOR SCOUT COOKING COMPETITION** - Annual for Senior Scout troop teams, from 1964 - 1965.

SENIOR SCOUT SWMMING COMPETITION - Annual Senior Scout troop teams, from 1965 to 1967.

TIPPETT TROPHY - Presented by Mr & Mrs John Tippett for Scout Cooking Competition. Annual, for troops from1964; for Patrols from 1968; biennial for Patrols from 1971.

WATSON TROPHY - Presented by Mrs G Watson for Scout arts and crafts.
Annual from 1968 for troops in Groups competing for PLINSTON TROPHY.
WHALEBONE TROPHY - Presented by Mr John Davies in 1962 for Senor
Scout special contests. Previous contests were Operation Tarzan 1959, Kon-Tiki
1960. Whalebone awarded for Tarzan 1962, Kon-Tiki– 1963, Burnup 1965,
Pheidipippides 1965, Tarzan 1966, Santa 1966, Ferret 967, Ugh 1967,
Opened to Scout troop teams and awarded for Kon-Tiki 1971, Tarzan 1972,
Chaingang 1973, Ferret 1974, Kon-Tiki 1975, Survival 1977

10th World Scout Jamboree - Laguna, Philippines

The first World Scour Jamboree to be held in Asia. It was attended by 12,000 Scouts from 69 countries including a carefully selected contingent of 105 from the UK, which made the outward and homeward journey by air. The trip cost each British Scout £300.00



Barbara Millicent Roberts, known as Barbie was created in 1959. Her creator Ruth Handler introduced the doll as a teenage fashion model in a striped bathing suit at the New York Toy Fair.



The very first Minis were officially introduced to the public in 1959. Originally conceived as a solution to fuel shortages following the Suez crisis in 1957 there were two versions, the Austin Seven, and the Morris Mini-Minor, which differed essentially, only

in the badge. This new mini sold for $\pounds 497$ of which $\pounds 147$ was the purchase tax.

- Post codes were introduced for the first time, as an experiment, in Norwich.
- Barclays were the first bank to install a computer
- London Transport introduced the production AEC Routemaster double-decker bus into public service.
- Associated-Rediffusion first broadcast the children's television series *Ivor the Engine*.
- United States Hawaii became the 50th state.

In the last sixty years there have been a number of editors - the longest serving being Kenneth Johnson (K.J.) He was instrumental in producing the first issue partly because he could type and also had access to a Gestetner duplicating
