# What does the poppy symbolise?

The first Poppy Appeal was held in 1921, the founding year of The Royal British Legion. Red silk poppies, inspired by the famous First World War poem 'In Flanders Fields', sold out instantly and raised more than £106,000. The funds were vital, helping First World War veterans find employment

and housing after the war. The following year, the Poppy Factory was set up, employing disabled ex-servicemen to create poppies to sell during the appeal. Today, the factory still produces millions of poppies each year.

By wearing a poppy, you aren't just remembering servicemen and women: you're supporting a new generation of veterans and service personnel.

# 8th Letchworth Scouts Garden City Heritage Treasure Hunt

On the  $1^{st}$  October,  $8^{th}$  Letchworth Scouts group went on a treasure hunt around Letchworth. There was a clue at every land mark. We had to write down letters on each clue and at the end we had to join them all together to find the sentence.

We met up at Saint Michael's Church on the Broadway ready with all our gear and clothing. We walked down the road to the UK's first ever roundabout. At this land mark, the clue was on the wooden sign on the roundabout.

Then, we walked approximately half a mile to get to Howgills Quaker Meeting Room. We had to look for a wooden sign board on the Sollershott East boundary of Howgills. We went on and visited Cloisters, Ebenezer Howard's House, Howard Park, The Settlement, Original Garden City Cottage and finally The Spirella Building. Each landmark had a clue to find.

When we had completed our journey and collected all of the letters from the clues we worked out the answer "Lord Baden Powell 1908" which is important to the Scouts as he was the founder.



I really enjoyed the treasure hunt and seeing all the land marks around Letchworth. My favourite land mark was The Spirella Building because we saw Ebenezer Howard's statue and it was the final clue to find the answer.

The cost is £4.50 per participant, and everyone gets a limited edition souvenir Monopoly Challenge Badge.


