## Membership Cost 2021

As you will no doubt have seen and read, The Scout Association which is struggling financially is putting up its membership fee next year as part of the process to begin to recover some of the monies lost due to the pandemic.

At last weekend's County AGM it was announced that the County levy would be set at £13.50 which is identical to last year.

The District Executive Committee met last week to look at the financial side of the District and agree a budget and levy for our members. We decided that to assist in offsetting the dramatic rise in The Scout Association fee to the Groups, we would reduce next year's fee as far as we considered it safe to do so whilst still retaining enough reserves to enable us to provide support as and when needed anywhere within the District. It was also agreed that we would remove the International Levy this year as there is no prospect of our Young People travelling abroad within the next 12 months.

Therefore the breakdown for the payment due for next year's census will be as follows;

Scout Association £36.50 (this includes a 50p discount for early payment)

County Levy £13.50 District Levy £ 1.50

Total due £51.50 per head for ALL Young People recorded on the Census.

Details of the Census, all relevant dates and login information will be circulated as soon as we receive it.








Chris Lewis, 1st Baldock ASL raised £60. for the Baldock branch of the Royal British Legion by selling the paracord poppies he made.
