The first mention of Beaver Scouts in our District was in October's 1987 edition of Co-Ordinator - Watch this space BEAVERS are coming - 4th Letchworth, 5th Letchworth, 8th Letchworth, 12th Letchworth and 1st Baldock.

In May 1988 the District held the first District Beaver Fun Day. Over 80 Beavers enjoyed an action packed afternoon at Norton Bury. The second Beaver Fun Day was also held at Norton Bury 6th May 1989. In September 1990 he District Beaver Scout Sports Day was held at the Grange School playing field.

We would recommend this company to anyone wanting an evening of educational fun.



that day. It was amazing to see how a little car made of wood and straws could go so far using the air in a balloon for power! We had a great time watching everyone's car and seeing how fast they all went!












