



1st Baldock Cubs

1st Baldock Cubs have taken on the challenge of doing our part to tackle climate change.

We are adding our efforts to those of Scouts worldwide.

The UN Climate Change Conference UK 2021 (COP26) will be held in Scotland in November where Leaders (and climate change experts) from lots of different countries will talk about climate change and what countries are going to do about it. Scouts will represent #PromiseToThePlanet at COP26

You don't have to be a scientist to know that climate change is a big deal. As Scouts we're committed to finding a global solution because we're led by young people - and they know whose future is at stake.

From June to November this year, 57 million Scouts from across the world will take a stand and work towards a better world by taking action to reduce climate change. They'll get hands-on to make a difference wherever they live, use their voices to inspire decision makers, and record their actions for the planet.

#PromiseToThePlanet covers four key areas: recover, recycle, reduce, and rethink.

Please join in with us.

As a pack we decided that each and every one of us could take these small steps

- plant something, a flower or vegetable or even a tree
- think about sending toys or clothes to be sold in a charity shop or go and buy something from those shops
- try to eat meat less often and taste some more meat free dishes
- be more careful about recycling at home and at school

Cubs all wrote some of the things that they are going to do and there is a display in the Scout hut.

Here are some of the personal goals that individual Cubs recorded

- plant some bee friendly flowers
- instead of throwing things away give to charity
- try to fix things so you can use them again
- help to take out the plastic recycling
- ask my school to plant fruit in the school garden
- walk to and from school every day, do not use the car
- reuse plastic bags and plastic bottles
- have a no electricity night at home
- pick up my litter and recycle it



We will record how successful we have been when we come back to Cubs after the summer.



The Scout Association has launched a new badge to help over 200,000 boys and girls build important money skills for the

future. The Money Skills Activity Badge, developed with the bank HSBC UK, will be available for Beaver and Cub Scouts aged 6 to 10 to earn



How to earn your badge:

- 1. Show that you know the values of different coins and notes, then design one of your own.
- 2. Choose something to save and keep track of how much (or how many) you have.

You can collect anything you like - it doesn't have to be money.

- 3. Show how you make decisions between what you want, what you need, and what you donate or share.
 - You could use objects, money, or online experience.
- 4. Choose a creative way to explain the history of money and the different ways we can spend money today.

How to earn your badge:

- 1. Show you know about foreign currency by explaining how a Scout from another country would exchange their money if they came to a camp in the UK.
- 2. Show how you'd create a budget for a Scouts activity.

Think about value for money, as well as how others (such as supporting business, making ethical choices, or protecting the environment) might affect your budget.

- 3. Learn about the things that can influence different people's spending decisions (from religious beliefs to adverts and peer pressure) and create a list of things that might influence your spending decisions.
- 4. Talk with your group about how people from different cultures can gain, save, and give away money, and choose a way of gaining, saving, or giving away money that you'd like to try.
- 5. Create a guide for how young people can recognise and protect themselves from online scams and fake, counterfeit money.


