The You Shape award will launch on the 5th October and is a new award for Beavers, Cubs,

Scouts, Explorer Young Leaders and Explorers it aims to allow more young people to shape their own Scouting experiences.



The Badge is in 4 parts The central badge, Plan, Lead and Represent. The requirements for each differ between sections. The award can be back-dated so if young people have already achieved some of the requirements before the award launched, then it's fine to count those parts as completed.

This is the only badge where young people decide for themselves if they've met each requirement. Although they must provide you with sufficient evidence.



I would love to see every young person achieve this award in each section they are part of.

I know it's a big ask but I think we can do it!

If there are any You Shape badges that are completed, and you would like me to award them, then please invite me along to your meeting, I hope to be very busy!



Badges can be bought through David Hawkins and certificates via the Scout shop.

Ways to remember: past, present and future




Since the British Legion was formed in 1921, they have been the champions of Remembrance.

In 1921, Earl Haig, Commander-in-Chief of the Army during the First World War and founder of the British Legion, adopted the poppy as a symbol of Remembrance and announced that he wanted 11 November 1921 to be known as Remembrance Day - today we commemorate Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day. His campaigning was successful, and the Act of Remembrance was developed into what we know it as today.

For Remembrance 2021, the British Legion are looking at the:

- past (how we have remembered since 1921),
- present (what we do to honour those who serve to defend our democratic freedoms and way of life today),
- and the **future** (how we will ensure our shared history of service and sacrifice is remembered) of Remembrance.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.
