8th Letchworth at Jambowlree




In November 8th Letchworth Cubs and Scouts took part in Jambowlree at the Hollywood Bowl in Stevenage.

Everyone had a great time and there were plenty of strikes throughout the evening.


The Scout section invested 4 of it's members while we were there.

Membership Cost 2022

National membership £34.50 (this includes a 50p discount for early payment)

County membership £13.50
District £ 5.00

Scouts of the World Award

Scouts of the World Award (SOWA) is a Scout Network only award that gives Scout Network members the chance to undertake a project of their choice within the themes of Peace, Environment and Sustainability.

Through your Scouts of the World Award journey, you'll develop skills and knowledge that will empower you to undertake a project that will make a sustainable impact on your local, national or international community, while developing your personal skills.

You don't have to go abroad to complete your Scouts of the World Award. Local and national projects are acceptable, as long as all requirements of the award are being met.

Whichever theme you choose for your project it should have a strong tie to the 17 World Sustainable Development Goals.

In October 2021 Alex Hawkins, a member of the Letchworth, Baldock and Ashwell District, was the first person in Hertfordshire to complete and receive his Scouts of the World Award. His project centred around the theme of sustainable development. Alex worked at a campsite that was in need of renewing some of its activity infrastructure. The campsite is based in a historic woodland and so all of the materials for the project had to come from that area. In addition, any wood used had to be signed off by the forestry commission and come from the site itself. Alex built relationships with key stakeholders of the campsite to ensure maintenance of the activity equipment for the foreseeable future.

To mark the occasion and present Alex with his award we planted an oak tree at Knebworth Park Estate. Family and friends as well as key people from Hertfordshire Scouts were invited to enjoy the afternoon and assist with the tree planting.
