



### Eyecare - for the Kit list?

A recent eye test yielded interesting information - Thank you Noor, Specsavers, Letchworth

We all know about the harmful effects of sunlight to the skin, and the need for ultraviolet (UV) skin protection, and we actively encourage the use of sunscreen and UV protective lip salve. But what about eye protection?

# 80% of the damage to our eyes via UV exposure from the sun occurs by 18 years of age (WHO)

Children have larger pupils than adults so much more UV light reaches the back of the retina. Those harmful UV rays may be directly from the sun in the sky but can also be reflected from surfaces. This reflected UV exposure can be almost as damaging as direct UV. The sun is at its peak and the UV exposure at its highest between 10am-3pm Children are especially vulnerable to eye damage from UV radiation and the use of protective lenses is recommended whenever they are exposed to the sun We should encourage children to wear 'good quality' sunglasses, those that have the European Standard CE mark or the British Standard BSEN 1836:2005 to ensure that the sunglasses offer a safe level of UV protection.

The sunglasses should fit the child well and feel comfortable - this will encourage them to be worn
