Another extract from "Telling the public" (Scouter's Book 17):

"Whether we like it or not every man jack of us is a public relations officer' for Scouting whenever we appear before the general public in uniform... and, to some extent, when we're out of it too.

"And take some of those places which we are pleased to call our Group Headquarters. A ramshackle hut with broken or dust-ladenwindows, peeling paintwork, with litter strewn around, might appeal to a few scruffy lads whose sole aim is to have a good lark around. It might be argued by a few well-meaning Scouters that some good Scouting has been carried out in such surroudings. Well, perhaps so but one cannot blame the public for forming the wrong opinion about such Groups.

"Rightly or wrongly people judge by what they see. What else can the casual observer work on? Would YOU bother further about anything which did not attract you by its outward appearance in the first instance? It's the wrapper that often sells the goods."

DEAR CO-ORDINATOR:

With Christmas so close at hand, it is quite natural for a Letchworthian so far from home to have his thoughts in England: but my title shows I intend to tell you a little about Scouting in Canada

Well, after ten weeks, I have been given a new shiny card with

printed on it, so I am getting around the District.

There are twenty-seven Troops in Oshawa, with two ADCs for administration. The District staff numbers twenty-eight, and proves quite necessary.

Here in Oshawa there is a standing camp, called Camp Samac, named so because it was given by a gentleman called Sam Macglachlan hence "Samac". It consists of seven log cabins with central heating, and refrigerators for the food, for Canada is a country of two definite extremes, very hot and very very cold, with no in-betweens.

They also have a swimming pool which is built to Olympic standards at Camp Samac, and a boating lake about the size of Radwell Lake (sorry, Radwell Mere).

The whole thing costs about 42,000 dollars a year to run - that is, roughly, £14,000.

The Scouting is mostly as done in England, with an emphasis, naturally, on outdoor life. They promote hunting, canoeing and winter sports as a large part of the Scout programme, but it leaves a lot to be desired.

Well, chaps, that's all for now
