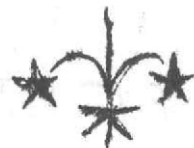

COUNTY SENIORS'

CONTINENTAL EXPEDITION

We apologize for confusing this (in CO-ORDINATOR 19) with the Winter Expedition, which is now in progress in the Lake District.

Writing in the latest number of "The Maroon", ACC(S) Charles Booth says this first County Continental Expedition is for individuals and small troops who are unable to muster sufficient numbers for their own expeditions - though larger troops will be welcome to take part as well.

The party will leave London on the night of Friday 11 August and travel by the same route to the three starting points of Bonn, Koblenz and Bingen. From Sunday morning, patrols of two, three or four Senior Scouts will set out on their individual 12-day expeditions, aiming for Echternach in Luxembourg by Thursday 24 August. Routes may vary from 70 to 100 miles; but each includes three chosen projects.

At Echternach, there are two days in camp together "to enjoy ourselves" before travelling home together on Sunday 27 August.

Entry forms have been sent to all Senior troops in the County, but. Mr Booth will be glad to provide any further information. His address, again: Wavertree, Barnet Lane, Elstree.

If any Seniors are not getting "The Maroon", we strongly recommend them to send 2s.6d. annual subscription to Ken Foxcroft, 36 Stapleton Road, Borehamwood, Hertfordshire.

COMMITTEES AND COUNCILS

It might be useful to define some of the various committees and councils we have - or should have - within our District and its eleven Groups. (The twelfth Group, 8L, is due to arrive this month.)

The LOCAL ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE is the body concerned with all District affairs, in particular warrants and Group registration. (POR 138, 139 and 144) It consists of the President, Vice-president, Chairman,, Vice-chairman, Treasurer, Secretary, CC, County Secretary, DC, any ADCs, District Scouters and GSMs. All these are ex officio members, but others may be elected. In our District, each Group elects one Scouter and one lay member. The LA Executive Committee may also co-opt members. (POR 143)

SCOUTERS' COUNCIL, though not prescribed. in POR, consists in our District of SMS and ASMs, Both warranted and acting, meeting to discuss affairs concerning Boy Scouts and Seniors in the District. For matters wholly concerning Seniors; the appropriate Scouters meet as a SCOUTERS' (S) COUNCIL.

ROCK COUNCIL is the corresponding meeting of CMS and ACMS, warranted and acting, from all Groups, to discuss District Cub affairs.

GROUP COMMITTEES must be formed in all Groups. (POR 202), to be responsible for Group property and assist the GSM. They also administer all money (in consultation with the Group Council), except the Troop and Pack subscriptions and petty cash kept by the Scout and Cub sections. (POR 208) The Group Committee is composed of parents; former Scouts, representatives of the sponsoring authority if there is one; any others who are interested; and the GSM. Group Scouters are not necessarily members: They should meet as a Group Council

GROUP COUNCILS are under the chairmanship of GSMs, and should meet, whenever there are two or more sections in a Group, to discuss Group matters. All warranted and acting SM(S)s, SMS, CMS and assistants are members. (POR 173)

The COURT OF HONOUR is the general administrative body of the Troop, consisting of the TL (if any) PLs and (except in cases of discipline) PSs. If the Scouters attend, it is only to advise.

In the Senior Scout section, the COURT OF HONOUR (5) has similar duties, and should consist of the TL(S), PL(S)s, and (if there are less than three patrols) PS(S)s. However, if there is only one patrol, that PATROL-IN-COUNCIL replaces the Court of Honour (S). (POR 247L)

In the Rover section, if there is a large Crew, the CREW COUNCIL meets to decide internal matters. It is composed of any warranted Scouters (R), RMs and Rovers elected by the Crew. In a small Crew, the whole Crew instead will act as CREW-IN-COUNCIL. (POR 261)

For internal administration of the Cub Pack, the CM should consult the SIXERS' COUNCIL. This consists of Pack Scouters, Sixers and (if desired) their Seconds. (POR 215 and 224)
