FOR READERS WHO

are not also readers of "The Scouter" we reproduce the following official information.

"From 1 October next it will be possible for a Senior to qualify for the Senior Scout Instructor Badge. In broad outline this new badge aims at encouraging Seniors to render service to Cub Packs and Boy Scout Troops as instructors.

"It has been decided that the wording 'Senior Scouts' should replace 'Boy Scouts' on the Senior Scout Tenderfoot and all over-15 Proficiency...and Queen's Scout Badges and that the First Class Badge should not be worn when the Queen's Scout Badge has been awarded.

"There will be other changes, too, in Senior Scout nomenclature. For instance, Scoutmaster (S) is to be changed to Senior Scout Leader. Assistant SM(S) to Assistant SSL, DSM(S) to DSSL... No change is to be made in the term 'Senior Scout Troop'.

So in case any Boy Scout or Cub is in any doubt, shorts are and will remain the only uniform for those sections. We have seen some who - well, never mind.
