THE CHARITIES ACT 1960

There was a notice in the June "Scouter", about the requirement for Scout groups or LAs to be registered under the above Act. Broadly speaking, the requirement is only if such units occupy or own land with their own HQ, or have an endowment income over £15 a year. Registration helps with rating and income tax relief, and forms explaining this have come from the County Secretary to all groups.
