CO-ORDINATOR began in June 1959 by saying it was "intended to co-ordinate ideas of Scouters and Cubbers by helping to ensure that everyone concerned knows what is going to happen, when." This intention has not changed, though the correct term "Old Wolves" is now used instead of "Cubbers", and the service now also includes the Guide movement. Letchworth District Rover Crew are the publishers of CO-ORDINATOR, and until recently distributed it free to all Scouters (warranted or acting), Scout Group committee officers and LA lay members, and 'Guiders. This year, in order to simplify distribution, all these readers were asked to pay an annual subscription of three shillings and LDRC handed over to the GPO the ultimate responsibility for delivery. Only one comment has so far been received in writing, and we reproduce it here with an invitation to all other readers to give us their opinions.

"WHAT IS THE PURPOSE AND POLICY OF THE CO-ORDINATOR?

Is it as its name implies, to co-ordinate each Scout.group together to ease district administration, or is it intended to be a light hearted news letter of Scout activities in this district?

If it is to ease administration, is it fair to ask each reader to pay for distribution of a necessary pamphlet?
