BOB-A-JOB ZONES FOR LETCHWORTH

These have been slightly modified, as shown below. The FIRST'S area includes Wilbury Road from Fix brook to Grange Road; Common; Norton Way South from railway to Meadow Way; Pixmore Way from Norton Way to Town Square; Lytton Avenue north of Meadow Way; Broadwater Avenue; Station Way; south side of Icknield Way from Spring Road to Bedford Road; Rowan Crescent; Redhoods Way East; Longmead.

A larger coloured version of this map will be on DHQ notice board.

SECOND include Norton; Croft Lane; Farm Close; south side of Southfields; Western Way from Southfields to Orchard Way; Grange Road; Wilbury Road from Grange Road. to Eastholm; Norton Way North; Icknield Way East.

The THIRD cover Meadow Way;

NORTON Norton Way South from Meadow Way to Baldock Road; Willian Way; Willian (except Baldock Lane); Manor Way; east side of Letchworth Lane; Broadway from Sollersshott Circus to Town Square.

FOURTH's area is south of railway, with Birds Hill; Rushby Mead; Baldock Road east of Norton Way; Lawrence Avenue; Whitethorn Lane; Newlands; Brandles Road; Baldock Lane.

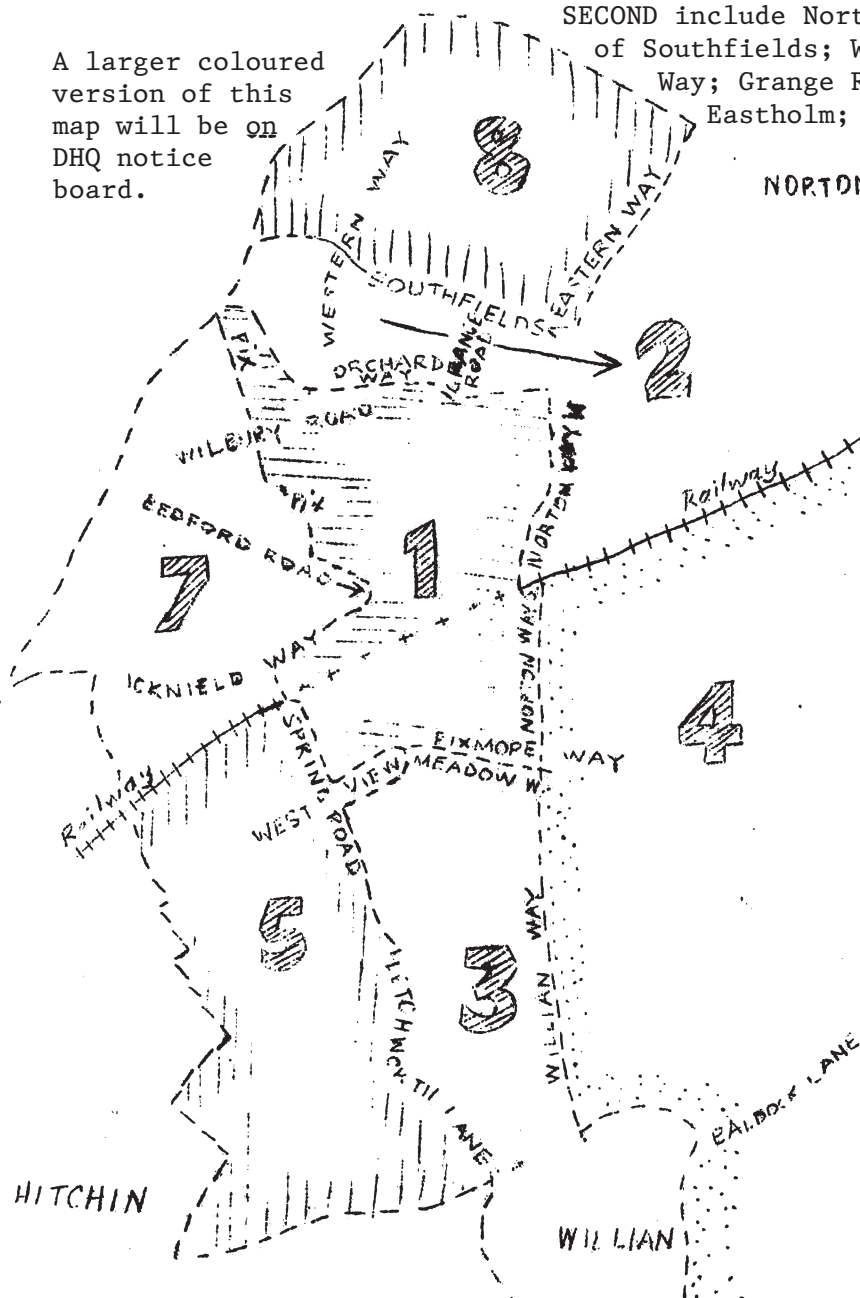
The FIFTH area includes (south of railway) all Spring Road and West View; west side of Letchworth Lane; Garth Road; Hitchin Road.

SEVENTH (north of railway) have north side of Icknield Way from Spring Road to Bedford Road; Icknield Green; Redhoods Way West; Runnalow; Valley Road; Wilbury Road west of Fix brook.

The EIGHTH area is bounded by the north side of Southfields; Western Way from Southfields to Gaunts Way; Eastern Way from Southfields to Gaunts Way.

NINTH, being a widespread group anyway, may get jobs in any part of Letchworth this year.
