# COOKING CONTEST 64

THE FOLLOWING IS A DRAFT OF THE RULES FOR THE PROPOSED COOKING COMPETITION FOR BOY SCOUT PATROLS, SUGGESTED AT THE OPEN SESSION OF THE RECENT PATROL LEADERS' TRAINING WEEKEND THE DRAFT IS SUBJECT TO AMENDMENT AT THE NEXT SCOUTERS' COUNCIL, WHICH WILL ALSO DECIDE A DATE FOR THE COMPETITION.

- 1. <u>Patrol.</u> Teams are composed of five or six Boy Scouts, under 15, who will report in uniform. They must be genuine standing patrols, but may if necessary borrow from another patrol one boy who is not a PL or TL.
- 2. <u>Place and times.</u> The contest will take place at an open-air site, to which patrols will have access from 9.30 a.m. Patrols may have access to the site from 7 till 8.30 on the previous evening in order to prepare kitchens, including the construction of ovens.
- 3. <u>Judging.</u> A panel of three judges will be appointed, who will be permitted to examine and sample the meals at any stage of preparation, and award independently ten points for each of the following: (i) Preliminary inspection of raw materials and preparation. (ii) Hygiene. (iii, iv, v) The three courses. (vi) Final inspection of washing up and disposal. (vii) Judge's discretion. Points awarded by the judges will be added together, giving a maximum of 210 for any patrol. The patrol with the highest score will receive certificates, and a trophy to be held for one year.
- 4. <u>Materials</u>. Cooking will be done on wood fires of any practical design. Firewood may be brought to the site. Biscuit tins or oil drums may be used to construct ovens. All normal cooking utensils may be used, and proper racks will be made to hold them.
- 5. <u>Menu.</u> Three courses will be prepared and served in the correct order, at an hour to be agreed between the patrol and the judges on arrival at the site. The courses for the 1964 competition will be: (i) Soup any variety. (ii) Braised beef, with sauce or gravy and three vegetables; or Baked white fish with parsley sauce and two vegetables. (iii) Fruit pie and custard; or Golden syrup pudding. Tinned, frozen, dehydrated, ready-mixed or pre-cooked foods may not be used.
- 6. <u>Revision.</u> The rules of this competition are subject to review at the first Scouters' Council of each year, when the competition menus for the year will be decided.
