BARTON SHIELD: FULL CLASSIFIED RESULTS "You will agree that the team test was not all that difficult this year", said Mr Barton afterwards. He pointed. out that the contest is based on the St John Ambulance Association's "Preliminary Manual of First Aid" which is a little wider in scope than the bare mininum requirements of POR. Individual questions were: (1) acid burns and Holger-Nielsen for under-fives; (2) varicose vein bleeding and burns and scalds: (3) bee stings and shock; (4) cleaning a wound. Ties were decided by higher individual scores.
