No Cub nay enter more than two events and the relay. Age limit is TEN-AND-A-HALF, so that Cubs born on or before 28 December 1955 may only enter the Scout events, which follow.

UNDER THIRTEEN:

- E. One width breast stroke.
- F. One width back stroke.
- G. One width free style.
- H. Diving.
- I. Relay of <u>three</u> Scouts, one width each free style.

OVER THIRTEEN:

- J. One length breast stroke.
- K. Two widths back stroke.
- L. One length free style.
- M. Diving.
- N. Relay of <u>three</u> Scouts, one length each free style.

"Under Thirteen" means not having reached the thirteenth birthday on the day of the event; "Over Thirteen" means having reached the thirteenth but not the fifteenth birthday on the day of the event. No Scout may enter more than two events and one relay. Provided that this rule is observed, boys under 13 may enter the Over Thirteen class, but not vice versa.

GUIDE SWIMMING EVENTS

Guides in Baidock and Letchworth Districts are invited to compete in events ${\rm El-Nl}$, similar to those listed above for Scouts. Winners of these may then challenge the corresponding Scout winners (events ${\rm E2-N2}$)

SENIOR SCOUT SWIMMING EVENTS

- O. Two lengths breast stroke.
- P. One length back stroke.
- Q. Two lengths free style.

Age limit 18 years on the day of the event.
ROVERS AND SCOUTERS CHALLENGE

R. Two lengths free style.

No age limit. Open to any Rover Squire, Rover Scout or Scouter male or female in Letchworth & Baldock District.

In each event A - R (excluding El-Nl and E2-N2) the scoring is: 3 points for first place, 2 for second, 1 for third. In ord; e to avoid confusion, names of all competitors are to be given to the District Information Officer acting as Recorder <u>before</u> each event. The decision of the appointed Judges in all matters is final.

THE MOD TROFUY

7L still hold the Mod Trophy, and the challenge to their Boy Scout section from 1W Scouts, to seven-a-side football, must be played by 2 July. If it is not played by then, the Trophy goes to tho challengers.

JUNE 1966

As everybody should knew by now, Norton Camp '66 begins on Friday evening, 10 June, to end on Sunday afternoon. Scouts and Guides will be camping throughout the weekend. CAMP WARDEN IS SM RUSSELL TURNER, 90 Bedford Road; Letchworth (phone 3245), and he will allocate sites to each Troop and Company. Rover and Senior subcamps will be included.

Amenities on site will include the Providore for sweets, soft drinks, etc.; a number of sideshows in the Minifair, provided by separate Scout groups; water; and latrines. There will not be free firewood, so campers are strongly advised to bring adequate supplies; anyone cutting growing wood on the Common will be most severely dealt with.

Activities will include a Cub Jubilee demonstration on Saturday afternoon; Rover recreational displays; the second part of the Scout Sports; the Saturday night Camp Fire, and Barbecue run by the B-P Guild; and Sunday morning's Scouts Own, which will be a Scouts' Own, taken by Scouters, so that Scouts, Guides and parents of all denominations may attend.

Full daily programmes, news and gossip will be provided in "Common News", edited by Terry Gray and produced on the Common by the B-P Guild in Saturday and Sunday editions at 2d. each.

CUBATHLON '66

This year's Cub sports are at Norton School field on Saturday 25 June at 2.30 pm. Events are: 80 yards (over $9\frac{1}{2}$), 60 yards (under $9\frac{1}{2}$), 20 yards hopping, 20 yards balance, 20 yards sack race, relay (2 boys over $9\frac{1}{2}$ and one under), high jump, long jump, and throwing cricket ball. Programmes will be printed and, it is hoped, sold by Cubs a week or so before the sports.

UNIFORM

There may be changes coming in the Advance Party report on 9 June. In the meantime, may we remind you that Cubs may wear Cub uniform to school on St George's Day, but not on other days; and may we pass on the recommendation that if Scouts or Cubs will wear jeans over uniform in public, they should be required to take off neckerchiefs and caps or berets. Let us have scruffs OR Scouts, but NOT a mixture of both on any one body.

CUB COMPETITION ENTRIES : A WARNING
