## CONVENER'S COMMENTS

While this year's art and handicraft competition is still clear in our minds, I should welcome any criticisms or suggestions so that amendments can be made to the rules for next year. The following points are put forward for your consideration.

Regarding VENUE, although DHQ is very convenient, a larger hall such as a school hall would be an improvement, especially with the competition growing each year. The Sunday afternoon seems a popular TIME, but it would be easier for judging to be carried out in the morning without interference and distractions, which would mean the delivery of exhibits on Saturday and general exhibition on Sunday afternoon.

The PLINSTON TROPHY is a Group competition, and to stay this way would include the Cub and Scout sections only; with Venture Scout Units being made up of boys from different Groups, it may be that they would like to compete as a unit, which calls for a separate Venture Scout trophy. While on this theme, separate trophies for each section might not be amiss.

An added incentive could be having cash PRIZES, such as first 10/-, second 5/- and third 2/6, with best in section gaining an additional 10/-, but this would call for an entrance fee of possibly 1/-, with a higher rate for SCOUTERS, if an extra section was started to give them the chance to set a good example (but not to score points for the trophies).

CLASSES for the contest need constant review. This year a Special Class was started, and this opens the field to more boys and helps to make up the percentage figures. Though this was not fully achieved this year, the special class was reasonably successful. What about a subject for next year?
