(1) IN ARTS AND CRAFTS

COMMENTING ON COLIN PHILLIPS' REMARKS (in the June CO-ORDINATOR) DISTRICT CHAIRMAN S.F. BLAXLAND WRITES:

"I agree that...DHQ...is not ideal for the Handicraft Exhibition on account of its size, for it is reasonable to assume that the Exhibition will grow bigger as time goes on... Judging should definitely be carried out before the exhibits are put on general view. I do not agree with an entry fee for the boys and feel that cash prizes would not be in keeping with our Scouting traditions. It seems to me to be far better on a group basis as hitherto, but I would like to see an award for each section, the Plinston Trophy still being on a Group basis. If you can get someone to put up awards for the Scout and Venture sections, I shall be very pleased to put up an award for the Cub Scout section."

AT THE SCOUTERS' COUNCIL ON 23 MAY, DSL JEFF ROBSON SUGGESTED that the Plinston Trophy show should combine with the District AGM, thus bringing a successful event to the aid of an unsuccessful one (judging by this year's AGM attendance). Using a larger hall, he says there could be other attractions such as films and live demonstrations, thus retaining people present till the AGM - provided also that the format of the AGM is itself altered somewhat!

(2) ON STAGE?

EASTER WEEK 1968 (15-20 APRIL) IS ALREADY BOOKED FOR NEXT YEAR'S GANG SHOW. But will there be a show at all? With Jim Bruce unable to undertake the job of Producer, can a replacement be found? Should a different style of show be tried for a change? Would Guides and Scouts work in a joint cast?

These were some of the questions chewed over on 10 June, when the Gang Show committee met at the request of older members of the cast who said they had some constructive criticisms to put forward. Unfortunately none of these critics turned up.

Always patient and willing, the Committee offered to meet the cast again on 24 June. Details of this meeting were given to all Groups and <u>all</u> members of the movement over the age of 16 were asked to attend to sign on for the 1968 show. This would test the enthusiasm for the next show.

The meeting was held. Apdlogies for absence were received from Mrs N. Baker, Jim Bruce, Mick Dilley, Harry Frankiand, Terry Gray, John Hilditch, Ken Johnson, John Tippett and Mrs K. Tippett.

- (1) That all Groups should have their pioneering equipment checked over and tested at regular intervals, with regard to condition and strength, especially where the equipment will undergo a great strain as in aerial runways and similar projects. If in any doubt, Colin Phillips has agreed to give any advice required.
- (2) When using sheer legs, they should be securely guyed so that they are self-supporting; and with ropeways, the rope should lie free across the crutch.
- (3) For use at District functions, a first aid box should be available, containing sufficient equipment for most eventualities.
- (4) At District functions similar to the Norton Common Camp, a St John qualified first aider should be present at all times.
