

### TRAINING

The "Hertfordshire Scout News" which accompanies Scouters' copies of this CO-ORDINATOR contains a summary of the new adult Leader training courses that are about to begin in the County. You are reminded that Leader training will no longer be an optional extra but an essential condition of holding a warrant. Hertfordshire County Council, as the local education authority, are able to give financial grants to Scouters attending such courses at Well End, Gilwell Park, or elsewhere, but for this District the annual limit on these grants is £73. This year's allocation is still largely untouched, and waiting for Scouters to ask for it. The DC returns from holiday on 15 August, when he may then be approached for the application forms.

CONCORD CAMP II will be held from Friday to Monday 1 to 4 September inclusive. It is open to all Scouts over 15 years and Guides over 14 years, and those wishing to go should apply to Miss C. ### EXAMINERS' VIEWPOINT

WHAT DOES A BADGE EXAMINER LOOK FOR WHEN TESTING A CUB OR SCOUT? We hope to print in CO-ORDINATOR over the next year or so a series of notes by the Examiners themselves, which will help Scouters in the training of their boys for the new-style badges. First, Miss Joan Ludford (Letchworth Children's Librarian) on the new Cub Scouts'

#### **BOOK READER BADGE**

1. List of books. Please make sure the boy understands that he  $\underline{\text{must}}$  bring a list of books, giving authors and titles, and must be able to tell the examiner something about the story of three of the books - these to be chosen by the boy himself. It is no use the boy trying to read a few books the night before. If he doesn't produce a reasonable list he will fail, however well he may do the rest of the test. After all, the idea of the Book Reader badge is to encourage reading! 2. Care of books. Please make sure that the boy brings a book, neatly covered, with him. It is not necessary for him to make the jacket in front of the examiner. Points to stress on care of books are (i) Keep books upright and tidy on a shelf if possible; (ii) Keep clean, (a) by making dust jacket, and (b) with clean hands and no eating while reading; (iii) Always use a bookmark; (iv) Turn pages correctly.

3. Use of reference books. The Cub should be instructed in the use of encyclopedias, dictionaries, etc. If any help is needed, the examiner is willing to advise at any time. 4. Arrangement of books in a library etc. It would be better if the Chidren's Librarian (the examiner) were to explain this, either to individual boys or to groups in library or at Pack meetings.

If any help is needed with this particular badge, there are three members of the Letchworth library staff who are also Scouters and who will be only too pleased to help. Please do not send boys for examination who are ill prepared: it's disheartening for them (and for the examiner!)
