The Chairman congratulated the District team for a successful year and thanked those lay members who had done so much to help the District in every sphere.

The District was sorry to lose Ted Smith, DC, and also Mr Fletcher who was moving away from Letchworth after giving so many years' valuable service to the movement.

It was a pleasure to see Les <u>Collins</u> back again after his illness.

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING were accepted, approved and signed.

MATTERS ARISING: None.

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR SCHOOL, BALDOCK

DISTRICT TITLE: The DC proposed that the title "Local Association" be changed to "District Scout Council". Mr Fletcher seconded the motion which was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr Fletcher explained the financial statement and gave the reasons which made the increased capitation fee necessary

GANG SHOW: Mr Baker gave a full report on the Gang Show activities and congratulated the 150 people involved for their active support. Thanks were due in particular to the new chairman, Mr Ron Page, Mrs Baker (treasurer), Mrs Tippett, Jim Bruce and Colin Phillips. After giving an account of the financial position Mr Baker presented a cheque for £45 to the Treasurer who thanked the Gang Show on behalf of the District Scout Council. The Chairman added his thanks, saying that he thought the show was the best for several years.

DISTRICT COMMISSIONER: Ted Smith said that his report had been published in "Co-ordinator" and that there was very little to add. He thanked Ken Johnson for his invaluable help and said that both Ken and Mrs Tippett well deserved the Medals of Merit awarded to them. He thanked all the Scouters for their work and support, and included the lay committee and badge examiners.

The census returns were disappointing as they showed a drop in numbers.

There was no information about a new DC. Immediate requirements were for an ADC (Venture Scouts), ADC (Leader Training) and Activities Secretary.

MR H.J. VINCENT: This was his first visit to Letchworth in a long time. He was pleased to come and bring the best wishes and thanks from the County Commissioner. He was very sorry that the DC had to resign.

ROUND-THE-DISTRICT WALK 10*SUNDAY 5 MAY

RUSS TURNER (Letchworth 3245) is general supervisor. ST JOHN AMBULANCE BRIGADE is providing an ambulance service. Check point staff are required: please see Russ as soon as possible.

Sponsorship forms are still available from DIO Ken Johnson. As we go to press, 106 forms have gone out.

The ROUTE is anticlockwise, through each town and village in the District. Trace the outline below, carefull, onto

square 2030 of the 1" map, or else get the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " map - KJ or Russ will mark any details you want. The route is marked at every mile with a numbered metal plate on a tree or post, and there will be various aluminium arrows nailed in at tricky places. Start at any milepost - DHQ (0), Norton Road in Baldock (2), Green End Weston (5), or Village Hall Ashwell (16).

From DHQ the route goes along Icknield Way to Green Lane - over the new footbridge - Works Road and the footpath over motorway to West Avenue - south by Weston Way to old Al - up Chalk Hill - to the cornet of Weston - turn left towards Clothall - right at first red house, along greenway, turning right to Barley Mow, then left by green way bearing right to Buntingford Road. Turn right: SINGLE FILE WALKING IS ABSQLUTELY ESSENTIAL ON THIS MAIN ROAD. At the double-arrow road sign, take small gate through field on left, make for pink barns straight ahead (north edge of Cumberlow Green) turn left, go through edge of Rushden and Redhill, turn left to Wallington - left at the Plough, by Kit's Lane - WATCH FOR TURNING TOWARDS-WALLINGTON LODGE, right, doubling back behind hedgerow and over fields - left at Lodge and down to Royston Road - over this and through railway bridge - up to Bygrave - turn right and up Chalkman's Knoll to Ashwell - turn left in High Street - past village hall - fork right for Hinxworth, where you turn sharp left in centre of village - at Glebe Farm watch for METAL ARROWS INDICATING PATH ROUND EDGES OF FIELDS: SINGLE FILE IS ESSENTIAL HERE TO AVOID ANY POSSIBLE DAMAGE TO CROPS - jump over ditch at place marked with metal arrow - follow arrows to end house in Caldecote - at other end of village, turn loft for Newnham - through village, along road to old Al (now 507) - cross this at Radwell turning - under motorway to Radwell - do NOT go as far as lake, but turn left through drive of Radwell House and straight on by path to gate and over fields to join the road turning right to Norton Mill - past Nortonbury Farm, take footpath over field on left to the Norton-Stotfold-Baldock road junction - along Norton Road to traffic lights - straight on Wilbury Road to Cowslip Hill - turn left along here as far, as Icknield Way, and turn right for DHQ, thus completing 25 mile circuit.
