#### SWIMINING GALA

STEVENAGE POOL

SATURDAY 25 OCTOBER

This year the swimming sports are being organized by the Letchworth & Baldock District Service Team, who would appreciate it very much if all Section leaders would complete the form which comes to them with this copy of CO-ORDINATOR and return it to Jonathan Savage, 36 Spring Road, Letchworth, not later than 6 September 1969.

A programme containing all entrants' names etc. will be on sale two weeks prior to 25 October, funds paying for pool hire etc.

#### RULES

Each competitor may only enter three events. Each section may only enter two competitors for each event.

One point will be awarded for each competitor. Six points will be awarded for first place, five for second and four for third. Entry fee is 3/- (15p) per Group.

Entries after 6 September will not be accepted.

The "Special Freestyle" event for Senior Scouts and Senior Guides consists of jumping into the pool clothed (as per test) and swimming one length.

Cub Scouts will swim one width.

Junior Scouts and Guides will swim one length.

Senior Scouts and Guides will swim two lengths.

## CAMPING AND COOKING COMPETITIONS!

Scouters' Council on 15 July, again very poorly attended, nevertheless got on with things and decided to hold the postponed Icknield Shield camping competition AND the Tippett Trophy cooking competition ON THE SAME WEEKEND! The rules are exactly the same as previously published for both contests, except that the Sunday lunch will not be judged as part of the Icknield Shield.

Scout patrols entering the Icknield Shield automatically enter the Tippett Trophy as well. They start at 2.30 pm on Saturday 20 September.

Scout patrols only wishing to enter the Tippett Trophy, and Guide patrols entering their cooking competition under the same rules and in the same place at the same time, have access to the site from 9.30 am, to set up kitchens, and to start preparation of the competition meal (along with Icknield Shield teams) at 12.0 or such time as arranged with the judges, in order to have the meal ready at a mutually agreed hour.

ALL ENTRIES FOR EITHER OR BOTH COM-PETITIONS must be submitted in writing (on forms from the competitions booklet, or else on plain paper giving full names, ages and rank of all members of the team, enclosing entry fee of 10/- for Icknield Shield and/or 1/- for Tippett Trophy) BY SATURDAY 6 SEPTEMBER to DIO Ken Johnson, 80 Spring Road, Letchworth, who will forward them to the respective organizers and judges of the two competitions.

Special note: "Lightweight" entries in Icknield Shield are entitled to arrange for delivery of food and equipment on Sunday to enable them to enter the Tippett Trophy adequately supplied. "Heavyweight" teams must bring everything on Saturday.
