THE MOD TROPHY GATHERING OF EXTRAORDINARY EXHIBITS ON 21 DECEMBER (results opposite) finally clinched Second Letchworth (Saint George's) claim to be the most active of the Groups in this District during 1969. Though their Scout Troop did»not bother to take part, the Cubs went all out to win, and gained 195 out of a possible 200 points - which, added to the points won by that Group in all previous compptitions last year, gave them the championship in the 1969 "JUST FOR FUN LEAGUE".

Fifth Letchworth, who have stuck solidly in second place behind the Second for the whole twelve months; were still there at the finish. The Fifth is the only Group in the District to have hit the top three places in the JFF League every year since 1963.

Fourth Letchworth emerged as the third most participating group of 1969, as they were in 1968. Eighth Letchworth stopped messing around in the mere hundreds of points per year, and knocked up their 1969 total to over a thousand, for the first time.

Seventh Letchworth and First Baldock, County-recognized "All Go Groups", were also in the more active half of this District league. In the less active half, 1-3L, 2B and lA showed disappointing degrees of participation in District contests, being beaten in some cases by the Cubs-only 9L, and by First Freshwater-Totland who'travelled hundreds of miles to take part in only one competition.

Champion Hills' figure is low because the only Competition for which they are eligible is the Arts and Crafts. contest. Let us look forward to an overwhelming entry from them this year.
