He also thanked Mr and Mrs Juby on behalf of the District for their invaluable work as Badge Secretaries. 1969 A G M MINUTES CONTINUED

The Chairman informed the meeting that the B-P Scout Guild had given f150 towards the repair of the DHQ floor.

Mr Barrett, seconded by Mr Sparrow, proposed that the accounts be accepted. Carried unanimously.

Mr John Baker gave a very concise and informative report of Gang Show activities, Rising costs had created financial difficulties but an anonymous donor had come to the rescue with £35 towards the costs. There had been a new approach to the selling of tickets which seemed to have been successful. He thanked Mr Fred Cogar for producing the show, Mrs Nancy Baker (treasurer) and the anonymous donor for their assistance.

Ken Johnson, District Information Officer, reported for the first time, and dealt with various methods of circulating news of the movement at all levels and stressed the importance of keeping him informed of what was going on at Group level. The Chairman thanked KJ for his work in the District.

The District Commissioner thanked Scouters and lay helpers for their support. He hoped that Scouters' Council meetings would be better attended during the coming year. He was sorry to report that mainly through the lack of Scouters two Groups had closed down during the

The DC congratulated the lay members of Third Baldock Group Council for the truly magnificent way they had worked to wind up the Group in such an efficient manner. He thanked the Group for all the equipment they had kindly given to the District.

Mr Turner, as ACC, brought the good. wishes of the County Commissioner. He said he was delighted to be back in Letchworth, and congratulated the District on the St George's Day parade and on a good year generally. He spoke of the County Cub Scout Activity Centre at Well End, of Lochearnhead Scout Station, and of the problems of minimum standards and money raising, and wished the District well for the coming year.

Election of officers (see page 1, column 2) was followed by the presentation of arts and crafts trophies. Mr Colin Phillips was pleased with this year's entries in the competition, particularly from Scouters and Venture Scouts. He then invited the President to award the trophies The Plinston Trophy to Eighth Letchworth Group; the Blaxland Trophy to Fourth. Letchworth Cub Scouts; the Watson Trophy to Fifth Letchworth Scout Troop; the Eaves Trophy to Melvyn Baker.

In other business, the Secretary said that once again this District had been last with the annual census returns, and asked all Groups to return the forms on time next year. The DC thanked Mr Lawrence Sapsed, newly appointed District Service Organizer, for the work he had done. The meeting closed. at 10 pm.






