BADGES - There are a few points I would like to make clear. Testers for badges are appointed by the DC (see Brownie Guiders' Handbook page 85, paragraph 2, and Guide Guiders' Handbook page 56, bottom paragraph). I an finding recently that girls are being tested by people I've never heard of, let alond approved. If you know of someone who would be suitable to test for a particular badge, please let me know. In most cases I am only too pleased to get extra help in this direction, but I must first satisfy myself that the person in question knows the syllabus (all of it) and what can be expected of the girls in the age range concerned.

Brownie Hostess badges Please may I repeat that only six Brownies can be tested for this at any one event. It just isn't fair on the tester for her to try to watch more than this number of strange girls and remember each one individually.

Guide Homemaker badge: The tester for this insists that girls under 13 are too young to have knowledge of the theoretical sections and they must also have had at least one year of domestic science lessons at school. This backs up what the Cook and Laundress testers have emphasized in the past.

HOW TO DO NOTHING

"CO-ORDINATOR" failed to co-ordinate last month. Its announcement of the meeting of the District Patrol Leaders' Council was pretty well ignored by about 50 of the APLs and PLs who should have attended. Apologies were received from the 4L Tiger PL, ba way of the 4L Lion PL who turned as promptly. Also there was the Council secretary, the 5L Owl PL, who had an agenda prepared in co-operation with the DSL, who attended as adviser.

As nobody else turned up, except the DIO rather late, no decisions could be taken on any of the items down for discussion. These included, besides the formal matters of minutes and correspondence, the following items.

- 1. The draw for the 1971 Scout football league, with the proposal to ask Champion Hills Venture Scout Unit to supervise the arrangements.
- 2. The draw for the 1971 Scout quiz for the Hall Trophy.
- 3. The DSL's proposal to arrange a weekend visit to Coetmor hill for PLs and APLs.
- 4. Details for Operation Nightjar for Senior Scouts.
- 5. Comments and criticism of the B-P Guild Cup competition.
 - 6. Reports of patrol activities.
- 7. Any other business members wished to raise.
- 8. Films of past Senior Scout activities which might be revived in a new form for older Scouts.

Item 8 was, in fact, carried out, and enjoyed by the very limited assembly. In the absence of a quorum, no official decision could be made regarding the date of the next meeting, but the Secretary has now booked Fifth Letchworth HQ for 7.30 pm on Thursday 17 December, and hopes that a better attendance will enable the agenda to be dealt with.

All Scouters receive CO-ORDINATOR, and it is available free to all Patrol Leaders. It would be interesting to know what the precise blockage is. Is CO-ORDINATOR not read at all? If read, is it not understood? If understood, are proposed meetings rejected as undesirable?

GROUPS TEND TO BE INWARD LOOKING, FORGETTING THAT LAY HELPERS, DISTRICT AND COUNTY EVENTS ARE THERE AS A SUPPORT TO THEM."

It is in the interest of all Patrol Leaders that this District is trying to encourage the District PLs' Council, which up to now has been one of the liveliest and most successful in Hertfordshire.
