Competitors will be required to go on or with unpowered bicycles along a course of approximately 2 miles of Ashwell Street at Ashwell, starting at one-minute intervals.

Entries must be submitted in writing, NOT LATER THAN SUNDAY 14 MARCH, to Patrick Byrne, 31 Mons Avenue, Baidock, giving (a) name of Troop or Unit; (b) name, address and phone number of Leader; (c) first name, surname and age (on 21 March) of each competitor; and enclosing 10p entry fee for each troop or unit so entered regardless of the number of individuals listed.

At the best attended Troop Scouters' Council in living memory, held at 1A HQ on Thursday 25 February, the recommendations of the Competitions Subcommittee were finally passed with the following amendments.

WHALEBONE TROPHY (OPERATION KON-TIKI)
To be held on 22-23 Nay; venue to be announced; separate section open to all Venture Scout Units; organizing committee, Michael Dilley, Harry Frankland, Gordon Reeds and a co-opted member from 4L.

ICKNIELD SHIELD: LIGHTWEIGHT CAMPING
The Icknield Shield is to be retained as an annual competition, to the proposed rules for a lightweight camping competition; organizing committee, Ken Hart, Jeff Robson, Rod Tiplady.

DISTRICT SPORTS

To be retained as an annual competition; metric measurements to be used for track events; organizing committee, Laurie Cook, Ken Hart, Jeff Robson.

TIPPETT TROPHY

This year's cooking contest to be held at 1B camp site, Bygrave.

OPERATION NIGHTJAR

This is the only competition this year to be open to troops outside this District, but the Nightjar trophy remains within the District.

HIGHER STANDARDS

A rota of regular visits to all sections by members of the District team has been prepared and goes into effect immediately. ADCs and the DSL will be paying particular attention to standards of programme and of uniform. Scouts especially are advised to watch that uniform is worn correctly, and it is suggested that activity dress be worn beneath, or changed into, for the appropriate parts of the meeting. Jeans with Scout shirts, coloured pullovers, etc, are not to be worn. Group Councils should consider financial help to boys genuinely unable to afford Scout trousers: your Shop rebate might be used for this contingency.
