DISTRIBUTION.OF CO-ORDINATOR

Despite appeals to the District Patrol Leaders' Council and the Venture Scout Unit, no volunteer came forward to help with the delivery of last month's CO-ORDINATOR, and more than 150 copies had to be posted, at $2\frac{1}{2}p$ a time.

This is a considerable drain on District funds, especially if it is to be repeated each month. ADC Ken Hart (who undertakes the printing of the bulletin) and DIO Ken Johnson (who types it) are both anxious to receive constructive suggestions from any member of the movement in this District on more economic ways of distribution.

We know from experience that it is quite possible to deliver, for example, all copies of CO-ORDINATOR in Letchworth in less than three hours, by one person on foot. No doubt two or more persons on bicycles might do it more quickly, if such persons existed.

Alternative methods of providing District information may be considered. Would Group Scouters prefer to have recorded messages relayed by telephone at regular intervals? Are Group Councils prepared to pay a higher District capitation fee to cover such costs - or the costs we already have to meet in stamps?

We await your suggestions. Urgently.
