## FOOTBALL LEAGUE

RULES for the 1971-1972 season:

1. Each team shall represent a Cub pack and shall be composed only of regular members of that pack.
2. Team members shall be of normal Cub Scout age, becoming ineligible for inclusion in the team on reaching their eleventh birthday.
3. A team is normally to consist of eleven members, but a fixture is to be played if a minimum of eight members are present. If less than eight players are available the game shall be awarded to the fully represented team.
4. Generally, if a game be void at the point of kick-off owing to negligence of any one side, then two points shall be awarded to the other side.
5. Duration of all games shall be 30 minutes in each half.
6. Two substitutes shall be allowed during a game. Additionally, an injured goalkeeper can be replaced with the consent of the referee.
7. Playing teams must communicate with each other as early as possible before a match to confirm the fixture.
8. Home teams are responsible for: pitch referee, linesmen, and ball.
9. Abandoned or postponed matches are to be played or replayed as convenient by mutual arrangement.
10. Home teams are to telephone the result of the game to

not later than Sunday evening, for the league table to be compiled and given to the local press.

(NOTE: The final league table for the 1970-1971 season appeared in the Citizen on 9 July 1971. The trophy was presented by Mr Don Morgans to Seventh Letchworth pack on 7 July).

## Norton Camp 1971

You will have seen from our June issue that the District Camp, normally held on Norton Common, is to be transferred for this year only to Nortonbury farm. MR 235352. Scout patrols from all over Hertfordshire will be joining us for the week end as part of the Great Patrol Hunt, and we hope will add to the large numbers of scouts from our own troops that will be present.

The programme will include improved "Its a Knockout" type activities for both scouts and cub scouts, plus hot dogs, sweet and pop stall, Grand camp fire, potted sports, and GPH projects.
