THE PURSUIT OF WATER ACTIVITIES is an integral part of the Scout

training programme with sections in the Scout Standard and Chief Scout's Award devoted to canoeing and dinghy sailing. As an activity, it does represent a higher than normal adventure risk, and in recognition of this The Scout Association has laid down special conditions to be observed when water activities are undertaken by the Pack, Troop, or Unit. Below I have indicated the more basic requirements, and I will be happy to discuss these and any more particular points with leaders planning any water activities.

THE DEFINITION OF WATER ACTIVITIES covers all the associated ones like fishing or skin diving, but in Hertfordshire practice at any rate concerns only boating If there is sufficient interest I would be happy to extend this District's efforts to the broader base. I digress: let us have the basic boating requirements.

ALL BOATS WHETTHR OWNED OR LOANED must have a <u>Boat Certificate</u>, issued by the District Boat Examiner - Mr Arthur Brown, 19 Stoneley, Letchworth. When applying for a certificate, please give the following details: Boat's name, length, beam, type, make, buoyancy, and class of water it is to be used on.

SEPARATE INSURANCE IS NECESSARY to cover the boat and indemnity against third party claims (POR section 6).

HERTFORDSHIRE SCOUTS PUBLISH A WATER Activities Guide, available from County Office, which gives the local classifications of waters, as listed in appendix VIII, paragraphs 14-33, of POR.

A coach is booked to transport the boys to Well End and return, the cost of which is included in the £2 camp fee.



LETCHWORTH & BALDOCK DISTRICT SCOUTS



- 1. The exhibition is held annually at a time and place decided by the District Scout Council. The eighth exhibition will be held at Highfield School, Letchworth, on Saturday 29 April 1972. Entries are to be handed in between 7 and 9 pm on Friday 28 April, and perishable items between 9.30 and 10.30 am on Saturday 29 April, for judging between 10.30 and 12.30 and public exhibition from 1 to 3.30 pm. The trophies will be presented to the winning group and sections at the conclusion of the exhibition.
- 2. In the event of any dispute, final decision rests with the Convener appointed by the District Scout Council, namely VSL Colin Phillips of 29 Haselfoot, Letchworth.
- 3. The following sections are eligible to enter, and will be referred to in these rules by these numbers:

SECTION 1 - Cub Scouts of any pack in Letchworth & Baldock District.

SECTION 2 - Scouts of any troop in Letchworth & Baldock District.

SECTION 3 - Venture Scouts, Scouters, members of Friends of Scouting, Group Councils or the District Scout Council in Letchworth & Baldock District.

If a boy has reached or passed his eleventh birthday on the day of the exhibition, the entry must be made in section 2; if he has reached or passed his sixteenth birthday, entries must be in section 3.

4. The exhibition is divided into the following classes:

CLASS A - PAINTING (Any original landscape, portrait, still life, abstract, etc., in oil or water colour)

CLASS B - DRAWING (Any original drawing or sketch in pencil, crayon, pen and ink, etc.)

CLASS C - SIMPLE HANDCRAFTS (Any decorative or useful article made from ordinary objects and materials found around the house and garden)

CLASS D - CRhFTJORK (Any handmade or machinemade article, not from a construction kit and not eligible for any other class)

CLASS E - COOKERY (Cakes large and small, or any other type of cooking suitable)

CLASS F - PHOTOGRAPHY (Any photographic work that has been taken by the exhibitor. Special preference will be given to work developed and printed by the exhibitor, in which case a note should be attached to the entry stating exposure, speed and aperture, and developer used.)

CLASS G - SPECIAL CLASS: This year's subject is to mark European Friendship Year, and will consist of a COLLAGE one metre square, depicting any European country, and must include the flag of that country in the design. The work can be a pack, troop, six or patrol effort, or by an individual.

- 5. The Plinston Trophy will be awarded for one year to the Group with the greatest number of points in sections 1 and 2 combined. Groups with two Cub packs will have their points added separately to those of the Scout troop (and vice versa). Groups with two Cub packs and two Scout troops will have these sections paired off by mutual agreement before the day of the competition.
- 6. Separate trophies will be awarded to the sections gaining most points: the Blaxland Trophy for the Cub Scout pack, and the Watson Trophy for the Scout troop. Any two packs or troops within the same Group will be entered separately for these trophies. The Eaves Trophy will be awarded to the individual gaining the highest number of points in any or all of the classes in section 3.
- 7. Points will be given as follows: 5 for best exhibit in section; 4 for first prize; three for second prize; two for third prize; one paint at judges' discretion for each highly commended entry. The best exhibit in each section qualifies for any other award.
- 8. Winners of the trophies will return them to the Convener not later than the day pre ceding the exhibition next year.
- 9. There is no entry fee, and no limit on the number of entries.
- 10. Leaders of each pack and troop, and individual entrants in section 3, are respon sible for delivering entries to the exhibition and removing them between 3.30 and 4 pm on the day of the exhibition. The Convener and his assistants cannot accept responsibility for entries not collected at these times.
- 11. No one will remove exhibits from the hall without notifying the Convener or one of his assistants.
- 12. Judges will be appointed by the Convener. No person will be appointed as a judge who holds any office in any part of the Scout organization for this District.
- 13. The Convener reserves the right to cancel a class for any reason or to limit the number of points for a class with a small number of entries.
- 14. Each entry will have an official identification label, yellow for section 1, green for section 2, and white for section 3, correctly filled in and securely attached.
