This biennial competition returns this year, on SUNDAY 8 OCTOBER. It is open to any actual and permanent Scout Patrol in Letchworth & Baidock District, and consists of a whole day's activities on foot. covering a distance of not more than ten miles. Each Patrol must report in uniform at 0930 and is advised to carry waterproof clothing, a 2½ inch map (sheet TL 23), and light lunch including the means of making themselves a hot drink. Clues and checkpoints will be found at given eight-figure map references. Each Patrol must be led by its PL or APL, preferably both, and though the minimum number of bodies is two; larger patrol teams will stand a better chance. The contest ends with the presentation of the trophy at District Headquarters at approximately 1730. Entries must be notified on the form below, to be sent with 10p entry fee to the District Information Officer, 80 Spring Road, Letchworth, NOT LATER THAN SATURDAY 23 SEPTEMBER. No later entries will be considered in any circumstances whatsoever, without exception. Points gained count towards Just-for-Fun League and District GPH.
