County GPH scores will not be included. A. District patrol competitions: 5 points for entering, +1 for coming last, +1 for

- each place higher in the results.

 B. Attending District PLs' Council: for a PL or APL in uniform, 2; both, 5; either not in uniform, 1; previous apology, ½.

 C. Delivery of Co-ordinator: for every 10
- copies, 1 point.
 D. Service to District, Group, Pack or community: 2 per hour.
- E. Badges: interest, 5; pursuit, 7; service, 10; instructor, 10.
- F. Progress awards: Standard, 5; Advanced, 10; Chief Scout's, 15; Service Flash, 15.
- O Debugal courses I was been reconstituted
- G. Patrol camps: 1 per head per night.
- H. Patrol hikes: 1 per 4 completed miles.
- I. Patrol canoe trips: 1 per 2 miles.
- J. Patrol cycle journeys: 1 per 12 miles. PATROLS must include PL and/or APL and be a minimum of 3 boys. Claims must be submitted for sections D-J on new forms available from 1 January.
