# WIMMING GALA

SATURDAY 1 DECEMBER 1973 : 7 pm at STEVENAGE SWIMMING POOL An entry form is being distributed with this copy of CO-ORDINATOR, to leaders of all Scout sections and Guide units. If it should be missing, or any leader wants a spare form, please ask DSL Jeff Robson (67 High Avenue, Letchworth: phone 4954). .Entry forms mast be in to him NOT LATER than Saturday 24 November, with 10p entry fee for each form. SPECIAL ATTENTION is drawn to the importance of getting the forms in on time, even if some names have to be altered later. NO ENTRIES can be accepted after 24 NOVEMBER.

The only rule we may need to remind you about is that no Scout or Guide may enter more than three events. who have reached their eleventh birthday must be included in a Scout team, and no-one who has reached a sixteenth birthday may compete in any Scout or Guide event; those in the junior age-groups (Scouts of 11, 12 or 13, and Guides of 10, 11 or 12) are permitted to enter senior events, but seniors may not enter junior events. Guests of all ages are cordially invited to come and cheer their favourite teams.

Encouraged by the District Patrol Leaders' Council, the District Scouters' Council has appointed a subcommittee to organize the famous nocturnal competition for senior Scouts during the night of 24-25 November 1973. Teams consist of TWO Scouts of the same Troop, aged 14 or 15 (or, with special dispensation of the District Commissioner in each case, 13). They report to DHQ, Icknield Way, Letchworth, at 2145 on Saturday 24 November, and are thence transported to the scene of operations, which will be in the rural areas south and west of Royston. Roads will not be used if they can be avoided, but competitors (who will operate on foot only) must wear suitable activity dress for a late autumn night, PLUS white outer garments or large white patches (armbands are <u>not</u> sufficient) PLUS Scout beret and Grpup neckerchief (which <u>must</u> be worn for identification purposes).

Torches; mugs; personal first aid kit; notebook and pencils; a few 2p pieces for emergency; and reliable watches are all essential equipment. Teams are given 6859). a series of map references at which they are required to report at specified times, with penalty

points for being late or early. At each checkpoint they are given a Scouting project to last for half an hour.

This is not an easy competition, and it is very tiring, but older Scouts will certainly find some new and exciting challenges contrived for then by the District team. forms are being distributed to SLs, but extra copies are available from the District Public Relations Officer.
