St George's Day 1974

Saint George is to be celebrated for the second time in a modern service in the Broadway Cinema, Letchworth, on Sunday 28 April, by courtesy of the management.

Scouts, Cubs, Guides, Brownies and Leaders are invited to take part in the parade, but if not in correct uniform should join parents and friends at the Gernon Road entrance at 1415. Correct uniform includes headgear and no non-uniform outer garments. Cubs must wear shorts. Assembly of uniformed sections is by the paddling pool in Howard Park at 1345. Parade moves off at 1410 by Norton Way South and Gernon Road (with police approval, against the one-way traffic flow).
