On the night of Friday 27 September, victims will be dumped without maps at secret dropping places somewhere in the United Kingdom. Following cryptic clues and using maximum intelligence and observation, they ought to arrive on Sunday afternoon at the finish, which may or may not be somewhere like Coventry or Peterborough. All available details so far are being circulated with this CO-ORDINATOR to Scout Leaders. NO later entries will be considered.

The last time that the Whalebone Trophy was fought for this way was en Sunday 19 February 1967. It was then described as a "Senior-sized scavenger hunt of unparalleled unpredictability"

Except for the fact that it is now for the Scout section (ages 11-16 only), the revived Operation Ferret on Saturday and Sunday 21 and 22 September 1974 will be very similar in character.

Teams of FOUR Scouts, representing their Troop OR Patrol, wishing to take part will report in UNIFORM at DHQ between 0800 and 1000 on SATURDAY 21 SEPTEMBER, to receive lists of the 60 objects required to be found by 1600 on Sunday 22 September.

There is no entry fee, and no entry form is necessary. Only the Scouts in the team applying on Saturday morning may hand in the objects at the finish; but there is no restriction on the numbers of helpers, they may get during the intervening poriod, provided that all objects are acquired completely legally. A label must ho firmly fixed to each object produced, showing its list number and the name of the team entering it. Three judges will award points with inscrutable impartiality, and their decision is final. The team with most points by 1600 on the Sunday wins the Whalebone Trophy for this year. All objects must be removed from DHQ as soon as possible after adjudication, unless otherwise directed by the judges ...
