Points are awarded automatically for taking part in all District patrol competitions and for attendance at the District Patrol Leaders' Council; and with the approval of that Council for service projects, camps, hikes, canoe journeys and cycle journeys, and proficiency badges and progress awards won by members of the Patrol, if claims are submitted to either of the next two Council meetings following the event and within the same calendar year, on the proper claim forms which are free on request from the District Public Relations Officer.
