## Saint George's

REHEARSAL: SATURDAY 1 MAY at 1100 SHARP: Cuts and Brownies at Letchworth Free Church: report to Colour Marshal John Baker; Scouts and Guides to Letchworth Central Methodist Church: report to Colour Marshal Rodney Tiplady. Uniform not required. Colour: to be cased. Each section should provide 1 bearer and 2 escorts, with up to three other members (boys or girls in that section) prepared to be briefed for other duties such as taking the collection.

PARADE: SUNDAY 2 MAY. Assemble on the Arena car park by 1345.

Scout and Guide colour parties move off at 1400, Cub and Brownie colour parties at 1403. Main body of Scouts and Guides moves off at 1406, Cubs and Brownies at 1410. ROUTE FROM CAR PARK into Broadway, in front of Town Hall and down Gernon Road: Scouts and Guides there turn RIGHT by Norton Way South to Central Methodist Church; Cubs and Brownies turn LEFT to Free Church. Scout and Guide colours will be led by Rodney Tiplady, Cub and Brownie colours by John Baker. Scouts and Cubs will be led by their respective ADCs, Jeff Robson and Harry Frarkland, Guides and Brownies by Commissioners appointed.

The Methodist Church service will end at 1515, and Scouts and Guides will assemble on the footpath in Pixmore Way, to move off at 1520 by Norton Way South to Gernon Road. There the parade will reassemble, with colours, Cubs and Scouts together in their Groups, and colours with Brownies and Guides as appropriate. All then walk as smartly as possible without conversation, up Gernon Road and past the saluting base by Town Lodge. This parade will be led by Parade Marshal Ken Hart, and the ADCs. Leaders and Guiders will walk on the RIGHT of the column. The salute will be taken by Mr Doug Drew, ACC(Sea Activities) and the respective District Commissioners.

UNIFORM must be correct, from the neck down for Scouts and male Leaders, and complete with headgear for Cubs, lady Scouters and all members of the Guide movement.
