ICKNIELD SHIELD 1976

THE DISTRICT LIGHTWEIGHT CAMPING COMPETITION is at Bluegates Farm, Ashwell, on 19-20 June. It is open to all genuine Patrols in this District - a minimum of three, led by the Patrol Leader or APL (thus enabling any Patrol with six members to put in two teams if they want to!)

Patrols hike to the camp site on a given course of not more than eight miles from the starting point where they receive their sealed orders. All kit must be carried on their backs in rucsacs, the total weight of kit not exceeding 20 lb. each plus 20 lb. per patrol. For example, a team of four Scouts is allowed $4 \times 201b$. plus 201b. = 100 lb. There is a weigh-in at the start, and any team carrying too much has its own choice of what items to leave behind.

The hike should take from about 0900 on the Saturday until 1400 or 1430, with a specified project to be undertaken on the way. On arrival, teams are inspected by three judges from outside the District (giving a maximum 20 points). Further points are then awarded as follows: Pitching camp, 30. Evening meal, 15. Night security, 20. Breakfast, 15. Morning inspection, 20. Special project, 10. Lunch, 20. Striking camp, 25. Bonus points at the judges' discretion, 15. TOTAL POSSIBLE, 190.

Oldest of the District competitions, the Icknield Shield began as a Troop heavyweight camping contest in 1930, but became a Patrol competition in 1968 and is now a lightweight contest only. 
