First Chingola News

Letters from Zambia take eight weeks by surface mail, one by air. Chris Anderson reports that our first parcel of record cards are handbooks has arrived and is being put to good use by First Chingola Cub Scout pack-.

Supported by the Mine Trust School, the pack meets in a large modern classroom and trains in the certain sunshine outdoors - though the rains are due soon. Most of the 18 Cubs are European Expatriates who knew about Cub Scouting beforehand. Chris is trying to get more Zambian boys to join, but he already has a waiting list and finds that Zambian parents in general do not seem interested. The poor, he says, cannot afford the 10 ngweo (eightpence) subs, and the rich regard Scouting as a "colonial" activity.

No standard uniform seems to exist in the Zambian Boy Scout Association, so First Chingola have settled for a khaki shirt-with the red-and-white neokorchief of his old 1-3L pack (supplies of which are on the way from our Scout Shop). The badge system is the same as ours, leaving out "Duty to the Queen" and so on, so the Chingola Cubs are soon needing some Bronzo Arrows (also being airmailed with this CO-ORDINATOR!)

Chris has contacted the local Lechwe leader (equivalent of Brownie Guider), and has sent some Zambian tourist leaflets, flags and a map for the inspection of any pack in Lotchworth & Baldock District - to be borrowed any time from the DPRO.

ALL GROUP INFORMATION OFFICERS ceased to exist at about 2045 on Thursday 7 October, and were instantly replaced by Group Public Relations Officers.

This dramatic coup was inspired by The Scout Association's national Public Relations Officer, Jack Olden, who wrote afterwards
