1978

- 1. The exhibition is held annually at a place and time decided by the District Scout Council. The fourteenth exhibition will be at Highfisld School, Letchworth, on SATURDAY 29 APRIL 1978. Entries are to be handed in between 7 and 9 pm on Friday 28 April, and perishable items between 9.30 and 10.30 am on Saturday 29 April, for judging between 10.30 and 12.30 and public exhibition from 1 to 3.30 pm. The trophies will be presented to the w4nning group and sections at the conclusion of the exhibition.
- 2. In the event of'..âny dispute, final decision rests with the Convenor appointed by the District Scout Council, namely ADC(LT) Colin Phillips of 29 Haselfoot, Letchworth.
- 3. The following sections are eligible to enter:
- (A) CUB SCOUTS of any pack in this District;
- (B) JUNIOR SCOUTS of any troop in this District;
- (C) SENIOR SCOUTS of any troop in this District;
- (D) ADULTS, namely Venture Scouts, Scouters, members of the Scout Fellowship, Group Councils or the District Scout Council, in this District.
- If a boy has passed his eleventh birthday on the day of the exhibition, the entey must be made in the Junior Scout section; if he has reached or passed his fourteenth will be accepted for singing; instrument birthday, the entry must be in the Senior playing; mime; puppets; recitation; acting the Secont section; if he has reached or passes dancing; and conjuring, by individuals or his sixteenth birthday, the entry nust be in the Adult section. (Entries will be grown)
- 4. The exhibition is divided-into the following classes:
- (1) PAINTING any original landscape, portrait, still life; abstract, etc., in oil or water colour;
- (2) DRAWING any original drawing or sketch in pencid, crayon, pen and ink etc;
- (3) COLLAGE any original design in fabric, paper or other material mounted on a base for wall hanging;
- (4) METALWORK handmade or nachinemade original metalwork of useful or decorative articles;
- (5) WOODWORK as for class 4, but of wood, not being made from a kit;
- (6) POTTERY decorative or useful pottery, glazed or unglazed;
- (7) SIMPLE HANDCRAFT any article made from ordinary objects found around the house and garden;
- (8):WORKING MODELS not from construction kits;.
 - (9) SPONGE CAKES plain, with simple

filling and decoration, to the recipe of 4 oz. margarine, sugar, flour and 2 eggs (NO ENTRIES IN CUB SCOUT SECTION);

- (10) LARGE CAKES any description, with or without decoration, though this will be taken into account by the judges (NO EITRIES IN CUB SCOUT SECTION);
- (11) SMALL CAKES at least six of the same type, as for class 10 (NO ENTRIES IN CUB SCOUT SECTION);
- (12) WINEMAKING home-made wines (ENT-RIES IN ADULT SECTION ONLY);
 - (13) PHOTOGRAPHY COLOUR SLIDES;
- (14) PHOTOGRAPHY HOME PROCESSED monochrome or colour prints, with notes on processing methods;
- (15) PHOTOGRAPHY COMMERCIALLY PROCESS-ED, - monochrome or colour prints;
- (16) MINIATURE GARDEN in container not larger than 12 inches across (HO ENTRIES IN ADULT SECTION);
- (17) SPECIAL CLASS (A) OPEN TO ALL SECTIONS design a suitable Letchworth & Baldock Scout District badge, with a short note to explain the designer's choice of symbols used. This may be fromw an individual or a number of people, and there is no liait on size or materials used. (B) OPEN TO SCOUT SECTIONS ONLY construct a pioneering project model to a scale of not more than 1:16. The judge will take into account the correct use of knots and lashings.
- (18) MUSICAL AND ENTERTAINMENT entries will be accepted for singing; instrument playing; mime; puppets; recitation; acting; dancing; and conjuring, by individuals or any number of persons eligible in the appropriate section. (Entries will be grouped into classes according to numbers received. No item nay exceed five minutes in 'duration. All music is to be..supplied by the competitors. Entries for this class must be on the form bolow and delivered to the Convenor by-liond y 9 April 1978. NO ENTRIES IN ADULT SECTION.)

- 5. The Plinston Trophy will be awarded for one yoar to the Group with the greatest number of points gained in the Cub Scout and Scout sections. Groups with more than one Cub pack will have their points added separately to those of the Scout troop (and vice versa). Groups with equal plural numbers of Cub packs and Scout troops will have these sections paired by mutual agreement before the day of the competition.
- Separate trophies will be awarded to the sections gaining most points: the Blaxland Trophy for the Cub Scout pack, and the Watson Trophy for the Scout troop. Any two or more packs or troops within the same group will be entered separately for these trophies. The Eaves Trophy will be awarded to the individual gaining the highest number of points in any or all of the classes in the Adult section. Points will be given as follows. 5 for best exhibit in section; 4 for first prize; three for second prize; two for third prize; one point at judges' discretion for each highly commended entry. The best item in each section will not qualify for any other award of points. Extra points will be awarded in the Cub Scout section to the Cub packs according to the order of number of entries (that is, the pack with most entries receives 13 points, the next 12, etc.)
- 8. Winners of the trophies will return them to the Convener not later than the day preceding the exhibition next year.
- 9. There is no entry fee, and no limit en the number of entries.
- 10. Leaders of each pack and troop, and individual Adult entrants, are responsible for delivering entries to the exhibition and removing them between 3.30 and 4 pm on the day of the exhibition. The Convenor and his assistants cannot accept responsibility for entries not collected at these times.
- 11. No one will remove exhibits from the hall without notifying the Convenor or one of his assistants.
- 12. Judges will be appointed by the Convenor. Except in special circumstances, no person will be appointed as a judge who holds office in any part of the Scout organization in this District.
- 13. The Convenor reserves the right to cancel a class for any reason or to limit the number of points for a class with a small number of entries.
- 14. Each entry will have an official identification label, yellow for Cub Scouts, green for Junior Scouts, pink for

Senior Spouts, and white for Adults, correctly filled in and securely attached. 15. An exhibit can only be entered for one year's competition..
