CENSUS 1978

Total numbers in this District were fairly steady in the year since the 1977 census. All Cub packs kept the same figure or dropped by a few, while dramatic increases in some troops pushed up the District Scout total. Venture Scouts are more numerous, thanks to the new unit, and a decline in registered Instructors is well balanced by the increase in warranted Leaders. Young Navigators wanted

The Royal Institute of Navigation has a new annual competition for anyone under 18.

We are all navigators - not only as sailors, pilots, ground controllers or explorers, but as visitors in strange cities, potholers, orienteers, climbers, walkers, drivers.

Animals also navigate long distances to return to their breeding grounds each year.

All these aspects can be part of this competition. You can think up some new technique or describe how you navigated to a destination at home or abroad. Or you can write about famous navigators in the past or future. The scope is wide.

Projects must be completed by 1 October. All competitors will be invited to a special lecture and prizegiving at the Royal Institute of Navigation. Prizes suitable to the projects might be binoculars or other instruments, a berth on a sea-going voyage, etc.

Individuals or groups can enter, so it is an ideal Patrol project for the summer. Full details and entry forms can be got from Derek Cunningham, ACC (Water Activities), 53 Heron Way, Hatfield (phone 64930). Ask for the form for the YOUNG NAVIGATORS' COMPETITION. A stamped addressed envelope would help.
