LOCHEARNHEAD EXPEDITION 1978

Despite a few injuries, overall the District Lochearnhead '78 Expedition was a great success and greatly enjoyed by everyone involved. As well as the walking, the sailing base on Loch Gair (a subsidiary loch to Loch Fyne) provided excellent water-sports facilities. As well as dinghy sailing and canoeing there was the 32-foot, 6-berth cruising yacht, the "Serena del Mar" which I'm told, much to my disgust, is of a design called a "Sloop".
