#### TRAINING NOTES:

Congratulations to Shirley Ross (4th Letchworth). Michael Mansfield and Ian McKenzie (7th Letchworth) who have completed their Basic Training since December. Their names join a long list of leaders who may wish to complete their training by applying for an advanced course.

The next Cub Advanced is in June, 8-10th and 22-24th, and we hope to make up a party of leaders from this District. The cost will be £22.50 of which approximately half, including transport, can be reclaimed from educational grants.

The next Scout Advanced will be October 19-21st, November 2-4th, 1979 and March 21-23rd, 1980, the cost being £25. Although this course is a long way off, now is the time to plan your arrangements.
