"WHAT WE WILL DO IN USA"

The contingent arrives in Dallas at 15.05 Friday, 13th July.

At the airport we are collected by families for 5 days' home hospitality in the Dallas area. After "home hospitality" we take a coach trip to Philmont Scout Ranch - on our first day there we are shown round the training centre. We are given a second medical and then a shakedown, all our equipment is checked and only necessary items are taken on the trail.

We set out on our trails on 21st July and they last for nine days. Over rugged, rocky terrain, each trail has a programme featuring a number of activities, old Western style - horse back riding, burro packing (mule packing), gold panning, chuck wagon dinners, living history, and wilderness survival. We shall also encounter modern challenges - rock climbing, burro racing, .30.60 rifle, and mountain search and rescue. During the trails we shall be able to see numbers of wild animals - elk, coyote, mountain lion, bear, to name but a few.

We return to the training centre on 31st July. The next day we visit Taos and on the 2nd August we depart from Philmont. On the 3rd we have a free day in Dallas.

We depart from Dallas airport at 18.45 and arrive at Gatwick at 09.15 on Saturday, 4th August.
