BIENNIAL COMPETITIONS TO BECOME ANNUAL

Council unanimously asked for TIPPETT TROPHY Cooking Competition to be annual from 1980, alternating indoors and outdoors. Also for B-P GUILD CUP (Winter Patrol Competition) to be annual from January or February 1980.

COMPETITIONS WANTED

Council asked ADC (S) to rearrange the postponed Operation Nightjar for the 17th November or 1st December.

Council also asked for a 1979 swimming gala; for a Whalebone Trophy coutest in 1980 - to be another Operation Survival; for a sports shield contest in 1980; and for a five-a-side football contest in 1980.
