#### KNEBWORTH COUNTY CAMP WIN FOR LETCHWORTH

The following information is given by a local Scout (who perhaps ought to remain nameless!):

"Ten Troops from our Sub Camp entered for the Trading Post Trophy Competition. We were set 30 tasks and had to finish as many as possible in the time set (this was something between 24 and 36 hours). These tasks included such things as knotting a Turk's head, taking a plaster cast from an animal's footprint found in the Park, an anemometer (wind speed indicator), a ballista (the "thing" which in ancient times threw stones as missiles), a sundial, and a distress reflector signal "thing".

"Each task had a value of so many dollars. When each individual project was completed we had to "bargain" with the Trading Post as to what our finished item was worth. 5th Letchworth bargained well, finished 28 tasks, and won the County TRADING POST TROPHY."
