FIRST AID COURSE!

A certificated FIRST AID COURSE has been arranged to commence on WEDNESDAY, 7th JANUARY, 1981 at 8.00 pm at Norton Bury Activity Centre. The duration of the course will be for six weeks, followed by a break of two weeks, and then an Examination on WEDNESDAY, 4th MARCH, at 7.00 pm.

All Adult Leaders (over 16) of the Scout Movement are eligible. The course will he conducted by a Medical Practitioner and a Qualified First Aid Instructor. The cost of the course will be £8 which will include the First Aid Training Manual - it is hoped to secure a 75% grant towards this course. Applications must be accompanied by a £2 deposit. There are 18 places on this course - because of limited space (demonstrations, etc.) this number <u>cannot</u> be over-subscribed.
