"We have queries sent in to us regularly about 'play—back machines' with which your clients are having problems. Our difficulty is that before we cap assist, we need to know if it is a Talking Book Machine or a standard cassette player. Talking Book Machines are serviced by special engineers and names and addresses are obtainable from this office. (Leahoe House, County Hall, Hertford 53201). Talking Book cassettes cannot be used on a

standard cassette player or vice versa. It would help us considerably if when you are asking for assistance on behalf of your clients you could find out which machine is causing trouble."
